LinkedIn MOAA Career Networking Group. Over 30,000 subscribers who receive weekly career development articles.


Marketing Yourself for a Second Career. On-installation seminars about all career transition issues.

The MOAA Foundation Community Outreach Grant Program enables the MOAA Foundation to fund local MOAA Council or chapter programs providing direct assistance to military and veteran families of all ranks in their local communities. Over **90 PERCENT** of military spouses who want to work are underemployed based on education and experience; the military spouse unemployment rate for those who want to work is 20 PERCENT, four times higher than their civilian counterparts.
